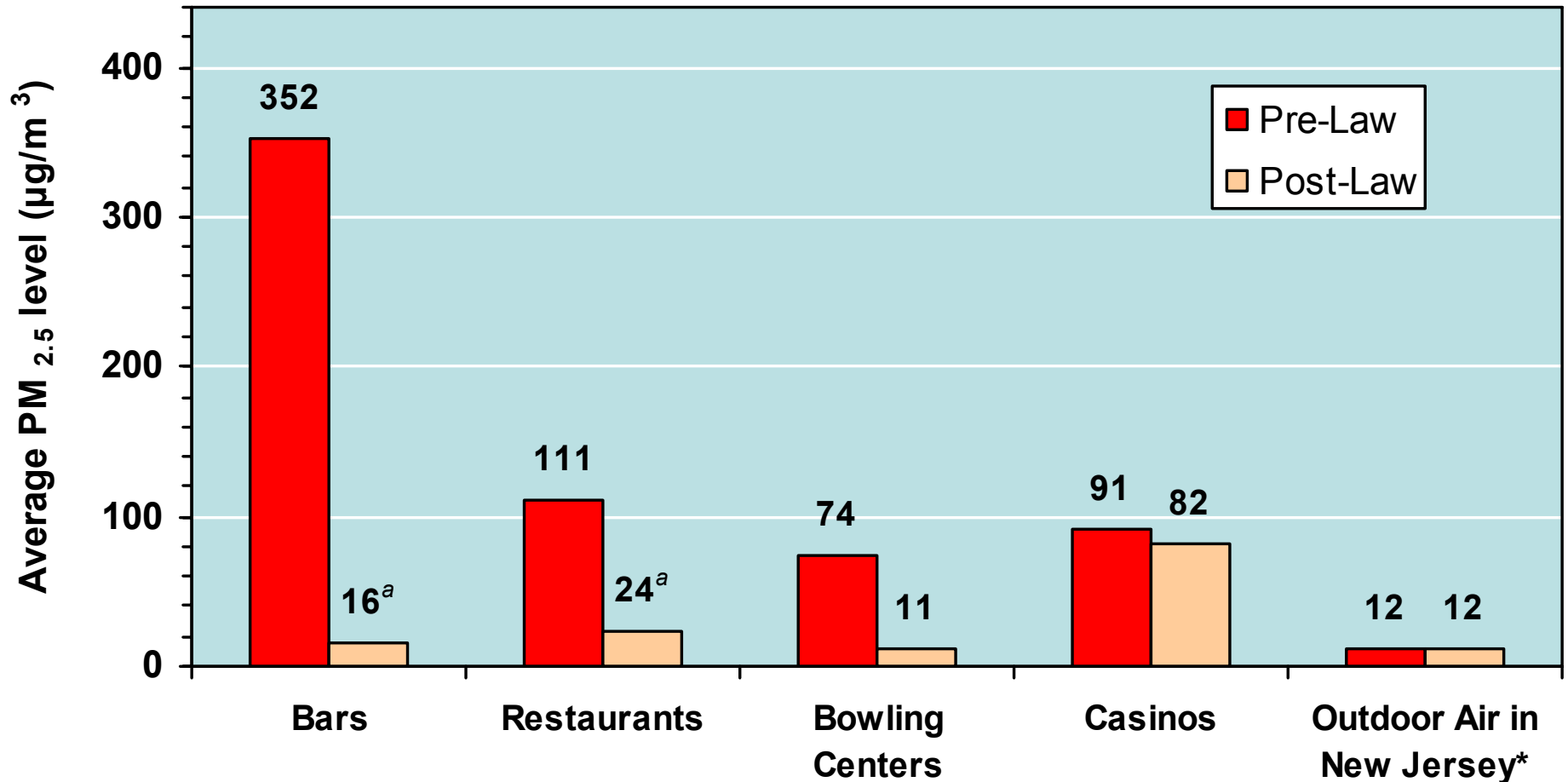


# Average Level of Indoor Air Pollution Before and After New Jersey Smoke-Free Air Act

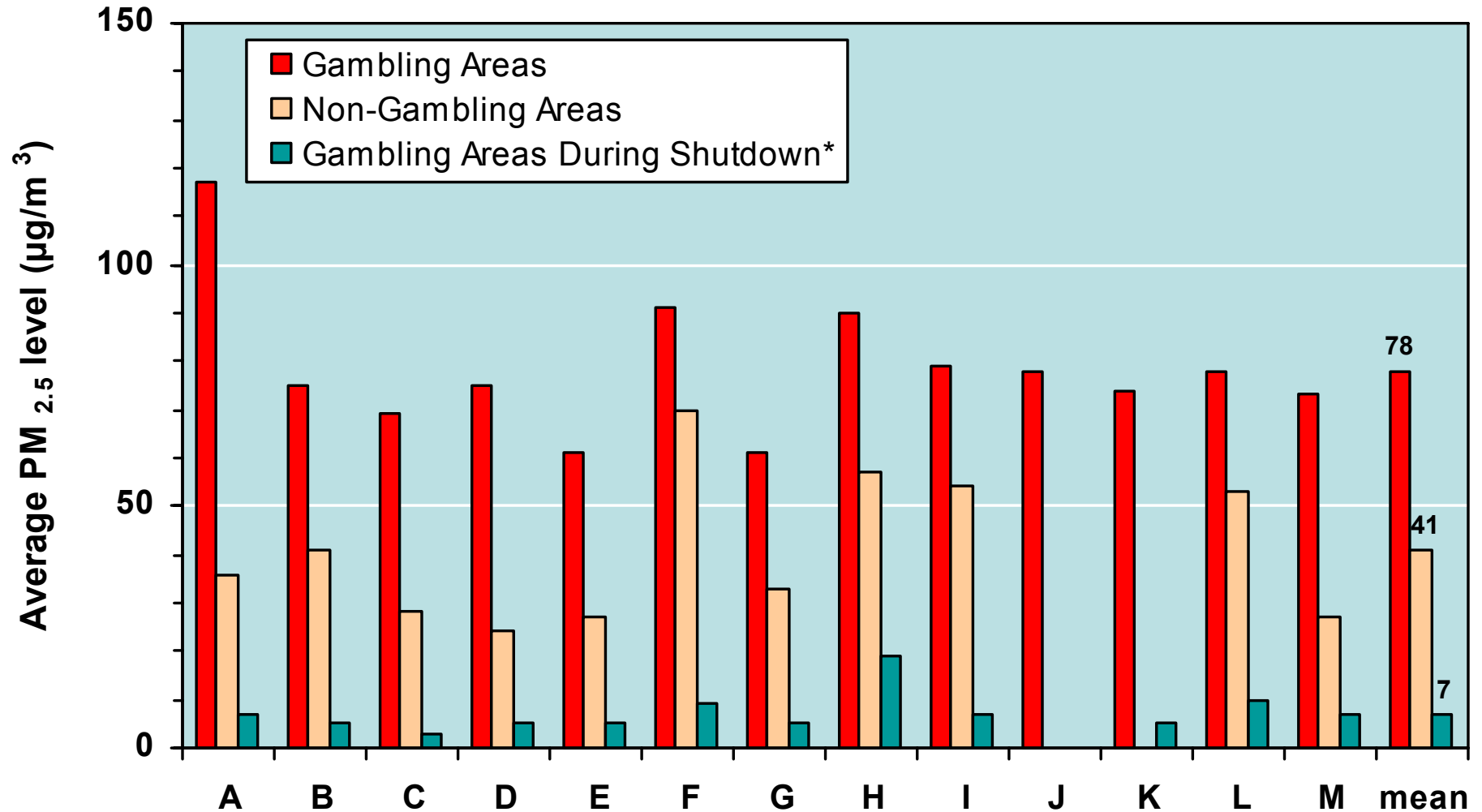

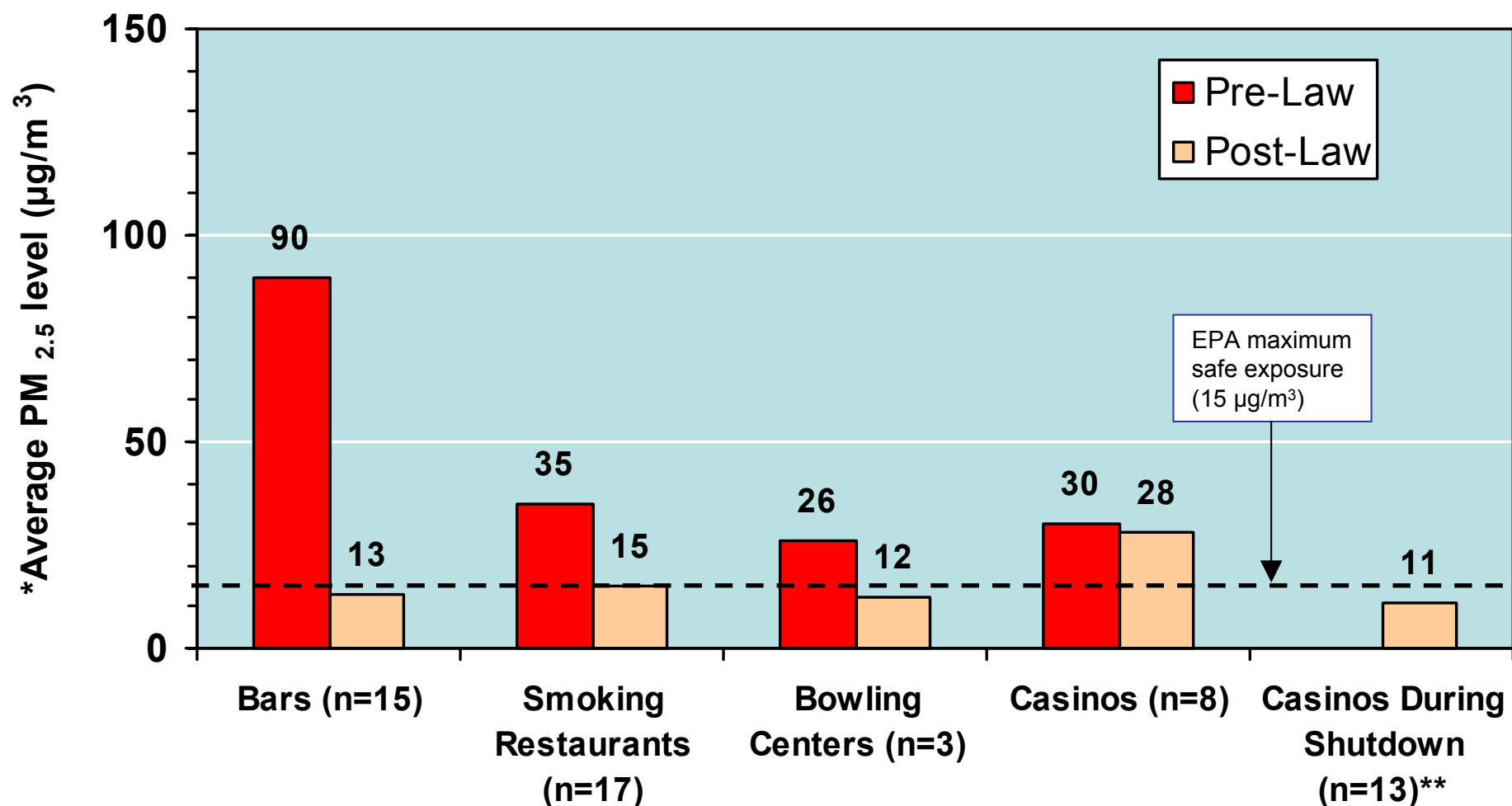

# Annual Employee Exposure to Indoor Air Pollution Before and After NJ SFAA
